**All A&S DEGREES REQUIRE THE FOLLOWING:**

A minimum of **124** total credits, of which:

- at least **104** credits must be in *Arts and Sciences* courses
- at least **60** credits must be *non-introductory* (from courses numbered 300 and above,  
and 200-level courses with an explicit college-level course prerequisite)
- at least **30** credits must be earned at UHM
- at least a **2.0 cumulative GPR**
- at least a **"C"** grade or higher in each major course or minimum GPR as required by major
